## Norfolk Island Gardens

**Duration :** 8 Days / 7 Nights  
**Departure Dates :** 03 March 2012

### Day 1: Saturday, 3 March 2012

Arrive at Norfolk Island where you will be transferred to your hotel.

### Day 2: Sunday, 4 March 2012

Visit the popular Sunday markets; see the local craft and locally grown produce followed by an orientation tour of Norfolk to start our tour. Visit sights of scenic beauty and historical interest. Learn about the Polynesian community, the penal settlement, the Pitcairn settlers and Norfolk's four settlements. Visit the Melanesian Chapel; see sentinels of Norfolk Island Pines along the coastline, the old whaling site, convict ruins and many historic buildings remaining from the islands turbulent past. A welcome lunch at Governors Lodge to get to know your fellow travellers. This evening attend a traditional church service at historic Kingston including the singing of old hymns and Pitcairn Island choral songs. **(B,L)**

### Day 3: Monday, 5 March 2012

Tour historic Kingston's restored convict buildings. Visit Number 10 Quality Row, a house museum furnished from the second settlement 1803. See Government House, All Saints Church and the historic cemetery. Visit some of Graham's favourite private gardens today including Camelot Garden where Robin Adams has created her childhood dream garden of peace and harmony. Then visit the Boniface gardens and see a huge selection of tropical and native plants introduced by the owner. **(B)**

### Day 4: Tuesday, 6 March 2012

Free time this morning to relax. After lunch take a 'Walk in the Wild' to one of the last remaining private rainforests. Norfolk Islanders are keen to preserve remaining rainforests. This eco-tourism attraction has featured on many television programs in Australia. Dinner tonight is a Sunset Cliff Top Fish Feast with young Tahitian Dancers. **(B,D)**

### Day 5: Wednesday, 7 March 2012

An early morning walk in the National Park to see the world's tallest tree ferns and Norfolk's own palms and natural rainforest followed by a hearty breakfast at Kingston. The chance to cruise the sheltered reefs of beautiful coral gardens in a glass bottom boat this afternoon. See colourful fish and coral in the lagoon at Emily and Slaughter Bays. A Murder Mystery dinner tonight: three course meal with Liqueur Tasting **(B,D)**

### Day 6: Thursday, 8 March 2012

Visit the Pier Store museum at Kingston with its relics from the 1790 wreck of the HMS Sirius which sank off Norfolk's Emily Bay. After lunch we call into the garden of a Norfolk Island garden club member. A four course Progressive Dinner in the homes of islanders tonight. **(B,D)**
